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Faculty Annual Goals and Objectives

Annual Goals: Teaching

Goal Title: Continuity of Instruction

Goal Description and Measures:

Background: The Continuity of Instruction group led by Wendy Creasey has signaled that campus departments should be prepared for the possibility of fall classes being primarily online.

Goal: Prepare RIS for providing outreach and services online for Fall 2020; inventory collaborations with other units and events and make plans for alternative arrangements; investigate and if appropriate implement (and promote) alternative virtual service models (for example, embedded librarianship)

Measure:

- By August 2020 in collaboration with RIS staff inventory fall outreach, services, and events
- By August 2020 develop and implement plan for RIS online instruction preparedness based on previous measure

Progress :

This work was completed by August 2020 in a number of ways. Video recordings were indexed in Teams for sharing among RIS, including topics and URLs to full recordings. Training and information sharing on web conferencing and asynchronous recording was integrated into RIS core meetings on WebEx, Canvas Studio, and screencasting and video editing softwares. Marketing materials for online instruction and classroom drop-in visits were developed/improved and the website and instruction scheduler were updated to reflect changes to our service model.

Goal Title: Eastern NC Information Literacy Project

Goal Description and Measures:

Goal: Collaborate with UNCW's Meghan Wanucha Smith on a project to improve information literacy in Eastern North Carolina. The tentative focus would be supporting the "community of practice" of information literacy professionals in ENC, mainly librarians in academic settings, to better facilitate information sharing, gathering and disseminating best practices, and creating a platform from which to launch collaborative actions. Improving communication between community college librarians and Joyner and Randall librarians is an expected outcome, as is improved services and support for the transfer student population. The ECU/UNCW Throwdown may serve as a model for this.

Measure:

- By Fall 2020 develop plan for the academic year in collaboration with UNCW's Meghan Smith
- By Fall 2020 develop a "community of practice" contact list
- By Spring 2021 implement plan/actions

Progress :

Several meetings were held over the summer and early fall to develop a topic and pitch. A contact list of eastern NC community college instruction librarians was created over the summer with the assistance of RIS graduate students. Work is temporarily halted while Smith remains on leave.

Goal Title: Improved Canvas Content

Goal Description and Measures:

Background: All Canvas content is currently authored by the learning technologies librarian.

Goal: Improve quality of Canvas content by developing program where subject librarians and content experts author Canvas content in coordination with learning technologies librarian.

Measures:

- By Fall 2020 collaborate with subject expert RIS librarians to author and deploy 2 additional Canvas modules/pages
- By Spring 2021 collaborate with subject expert RIS librarians to author and deploy 4 additional Canvas modules/pages

Progress :

At present 4 new business-themed modules have been developed. Work continues on this goal.

Goal Title: Information Literacy Concepts

Goal Description and Measures:

Background: The Information Literacy Concepts ebook continues to receive a small amount of interest from other libraries/librarians. The scope of coverage is usually cited (good coverage of topics without being too in-depth), but it could be more useful if certain sections were expanded and new graphics and questions added.

Goal: Update the content of Information Literacy Concepts to include new study questions, graphics, and revised content where appropriate.

Measure:

- By Spring 2021 produce a second edition of Information Literacy Concepts
- By Spring 2021 distribute second edition to repositories, the institutional repository, and the library instruction libguide, and other existing locations

Progress :

Minor updates to the Information Literacy Concepts ebook were made and uploaded to the libguide and repositories during the fall. An editable Word version of the text was created and added to the libguide (and shared by email with a college instructor who used the text for a fall 2020 class.) More extensive edits are ongoing.

Goal Title: One Search tutorials inventory and updates

Goal Description and Measures:

Goal: Inventory and update any tutorials that use outdated OneSearch and database interfaces. Even the concept-based tutorials make use of screenshots or sample clips, and they need to be reviewed, updated, or in some cases replaced. Some of these

Measures:

- By Fall 2020 update One Search video tutorial and any other high-use tutorials with most recent version of library webpage and most recent database interfaces
- By Fall 2020 check all existing tutorials for needed updates
- By Fall 2020 embed new One Search video tutorial and any other tutorials updated in fall into libguides, the library's tutorial page, and in Canvas
- By Spring 2021 update any remaining tutorials
- By Spring 2021 embed updated materials in all relevant libguides, the library's tutorial page, and in Canvas

Goal Title: Standardized Instruction Across Sections

Goal Description and Measures:

1. COAD 1000/ENGL 1100 standardization of instruction across sections. Form group of RIS COAD 1000 and ENGL 1100 instructors to collaboratively draft a shared lesson plan and presentation. To better support the staggering of instruction and control quality of instruction, articulating and committing to a set of outcomes for first-year composition is an important step. Those outcomes may help to inform a future instrument to measure baseline information literacy skills of incoming freshman and transfer students, should that opportunity arise.

Measures:

- By summer 2019, establish group comprised of all COAD 1000 and ENGL 1100 instructors to share best practices and experiences
- By summer 2019, group gathers and processes all available COAD 1000 and ENGL 1100 syllabi and assignment descriptions

By fall 2020, teach COAD 1000 and ENGL 1100 from single shared lesson plan and presentation

Progress :

Over the summer of 2019 I created the ENGL 1100 Instructor Group, comprised of myself, Willis, Grace, Hunt, and Lanham (Lanham is our primary fall COAD 1000 instructor.) The group met on 6/7, 6/21, 7/25, 8/5, 1/10/20, and 5/8/20, as well as via email and shared documents. To develop a shared lesson plan and presentation we collaborated via a newly created ENGL 1100 Instructor Group Teams group where we shared existing lesson plans and existing presentations. Our work was accomplished in time for the fall 2019 semester. Throughout the academic year we also gathered assignment descriptions and syllabi and shared teaching examples and strategies.

The group has accomplished its goal of standardizing instruction and has greatly improved communication among the members. To my mind it has also fostered a new sense of ownership and responsibility over the quality and content of ENGL 1100 library instruction among its members. Lanham participated in all meetings of the group and taught the majority of COAD 1000 sections in the fall, making a separate COAD group unnecessary. I shared the existing COAD 1000 lesson plan with him last year, which proved sufficiently staggered with ENGL 1100 instruction (as it emphasized building locations and locating print materials on the shelves.) To my mind his experience with the ENGL 1100 Instructor Group sharpened his sense of these unique COAD 1000 outcomes, as he requested additional content for the iPad activity to better reflect those outcomes.

Goal Title: Writing Foundations/Composition Instructor Group

Goal Description and Measures:

Background: In Fall 2019 an ENGL 1100 group was created and met several times during the academic year. One purpose for the group was to support SHRA library instructors with a standardized classroom presentation, with frustrations and uncertainties about teaching, and to ensure the same content was being delivered in every ENGL 1100 class.

Goal: Convert the ENGL 1100 group into a Writing Foundations/Composition group in order to include ENGL 2201 library instructors in group meetings and to make sure the same concepts are being covered in each class. Having both sets of instructors in the same meeting would also have the benefit of giving us more opportunities to communicate on content and more effectively stagger it across 1100 and 2201.

- By Fall 2020 reform the ENGL 1100 instructor's group as the Writing Foundations/Composition group, expanding the original group by including ENGL 2201 instructors
- By December 2020 have a collaboratively developed set lesson plan and presentation for ENGL 2201
- By Spring 2021 hold at least 5 meetings of the combined instruction group

Progress :

This group has been created and has met via WebEx and communicated by email. A Teams group was created and materials such as syllabi and assignments solicited for purposes of sharing and planning. During this time the original ENGL 1100 group has continued to meet.
