Significance and Impact of Research Presentations and Exhibitions

Artist Presentations

While exhibitions immediately come to mind when considering the presentation of art objects, other methods such as visiting artist lectures and gallery talks are a common and important part of giving viewers insight into the background and context of a body of research. Usually about an hour long, these lectures involve dozens of images of finished artworks, in-process work and artistic inspirations. They give a wonderful detailed narrative about the artist and artwork and allow a more direct connection with the audience. During my time in rank, I have been invited to lecture at Old Dominion University, Northern Michigan University, California College of Art, Lehigh University, San Diego State University, Maine College of Art, Virginia Commonwealth University, the University of Southern Indiana, and the South Bend Museum of Art, to name some. Often hosted by school furniture design and woodworking programs, these presentations are advertised and open to the public, and usually well attended by local artists and woodworkers as well as students, and have helped to introduce my work to the next generation of makers. Programs typically bring in only one or two visiting artists a year, with area faculty deciding whom to invite, based on what might be good for their students. While the presentations are a great way to have more direct contact with an audience, they are also a good measure of an artist's relevance in the field, as respected peers are deciding whose work is worth sharing in a more direct way with their students. Many of the faculty are members of the Furniture Society Organization, and were introduced to me and my work through numerous lectures and panel discussions I've been a part of at FS organized events.

Selected Group Exhibitions Juried/Invitational

Group exhibitions are a way to exhibit work with other talented artists in venues such as museums and galleries that share artworks with a broad public audience. They are also significant in that they offer an opportunity to put my research in front of important curators in the field. Having work not only seen, but juried into an exhibition by a respected curator is a validation of the research, and an opportunity to continue growing a reputation. Below is a brief description of two group exhibitions – a complete list can be found in the Curriculum Vitae portion of this application.


2016 Why Wood, Sculptural Objects, Fine Art (SOFA) Fair, Navy Pier, Chicago, IL

Juried by Jennifer Navva Milliken, Curator of Craft at Bellevue Arts Museum in Bellevue, WA. Milliken chose work by 27 artists for this exhibition that "push the boundaries of technique and material and exemplify creativity, outstanding workmanship, and aesthetically appealing design elements." The SOFA Fair showcases artworks that "cross the boundaries of fine art, decorative art and design" and draws an average of 35,000 visitors every year. My piece, Shark Fin Cabinet, was chosen and I was asked to be part of a panel discussion about the work moderated by Milliken. **Scope: International**

2016 Touch: Interactive Craft, Arrowmont School of Art and Crafts Gallery, Gatlinburg, TN Juried by Emily Zilber, the Ronald L. and Anita C. Wornick Curator of Contemporary Decorative Arts at the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston who chose 52 works from 158 submissions each containing between 1 and 3 proposed pieces. Zilber chose my piece, Symbiosis #4, and awarded it the Third Place prize in the exhibition. Scope: National
